Clark Regional Wastewater District is located in Clark County, Washington. Sometimes mistaken as a department of Clark County government, we are an entirely separate agency in both management and funding.

The District currently contracts with Clark County and the City of Vancouver for wastewater treatment services. These costs represent approximately 60% of our annual operating budget.

Facilities

The District manages over 40 square miles of service area, including 500 miles of pipe with 50 pump stations.

We currently provide service to the following unincorporated areas: Hazel Dell, Salmon Creek, Felida, Lakeshore, Pleasant Valley, Orchards, Meadow Glade, Hockinson, the Fairgrounds area and Brush Prairie.

The District serves over 24,000 customers, with a population of over 81,000.

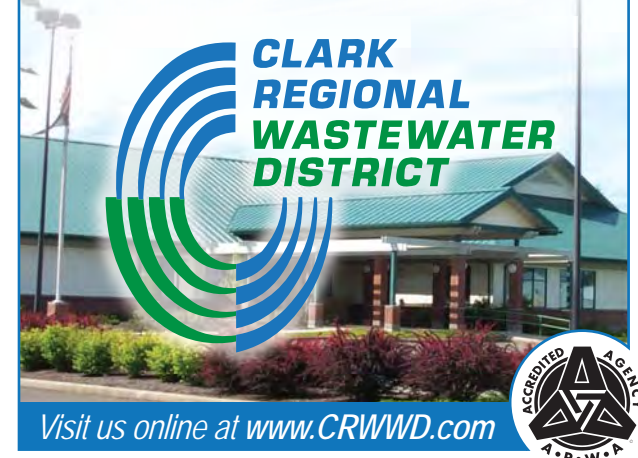

Welcome to the District

Clark Regional Wastewater District is a special purpose district providing wastewater services. The District was formed in 1958 by a group of local businessmen who foresaw a time when septic systems would be inadequate to meet the sewer service needs of the area's growing population.

In 2004 we were the first special purpose district to receive accreditation from the American Public Works Association. The purpose of the accreditation program is to provide a means of formally verifying and recognizing public works agencies for compliance with the recommended practices set forth in the Public Works Management Practices Manual.

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Sewer Service Rates

Day-to-day service is paid for by a monthly sewer service fee to our customers. Residential customers are billed bi-monthly at a current rate of \$34.00 per ERU per month, while commercial customers are billed monthly at rates based on the characteristics of the business. The District's sewer service rates are some of the most competitive in the County.

New Connection Charges

All new customers connecting to the system will be required to obtain a permit and pay the appropriate charges and fees, which may include one or all of the following:

- **General Facilities Charge (GFC):** The District currently charges \$1,898. This charge is used to pay for upgrades to the pipes and pump stations that make up the collection system.
- **Regional Facilities Charge (RFC):** All customers served by the Salmon Creek Treatment Plant are subject to the RFC. It is currently set at \$4,444 to pay for improvements and expansion of the County-owned treatment plant.
- **Permit/Inspection Fee:** The District currently charges \$110 for the permit/inspection fee.

Additional fees may be required for connection based on construction costs. Contact Engineering staff with any questions regarding availability and/or charges.

District Commissioners

The operations of the District are overseen by the Board of Commissioners (Board). The Board members are elected by residents within the annexed boundaries of the District to serve six-year terms. There are three positions - President, Vice President and Secretary. The Board is responsible for setting rates and charges and they also set the policies of the District.
