District Board Adopts Balanced Budget

On December 23, the Board of Commissioners adopted a balanced \$36 million budget, which includes the following highlights:

Expenses

- \$5.8 million treatment costs (16%).
 Treatment is one of the District's largest costs.
- \$7.3 million operational costs (20%). We move approximately 8 million gallons of sewage each day from your homes and businesses to the treatment plants.
- \$3.4 million debt service (10%).
 Annual debt payments for capital infrastructure.
- \$19.5 million construction costs (54%). In order to provide efficient and reliable service, we allocate this money to ensure we continue to repair and expand the sewer system, including the Discovery Corridor Wastewater Transmission System connecting Ridgefield to the District collection system.

Revenues

- \$16.5 million monthly sewer rates (46%). As a non-profit utility, your sewer payments fund the majority of our operations.
- \$3.5 million connection charges (10%). Development and new customers pay their fair share of the system.

- \$2.0 million investments and other income (5%).
- \$9.4 million low-cost Washington state loans (26%).
- \$4.6 million District reserves (13%).


