Providing Reliable Service Every Day – Part IV

Keeping your system working in all types of weather

Remote monitoring

The District has developed an electronic monitoring system to keep an eye on pump stations 24/7, ensuring that sewers flow reliably every day of the year. The monitoring system is useful year-round, reducing staff time needed to check each station in person. But it becomes critical during adverse weather conditions, when immediate notice of power outages and other problems could stop a potential overflow.

Draining the bathtub

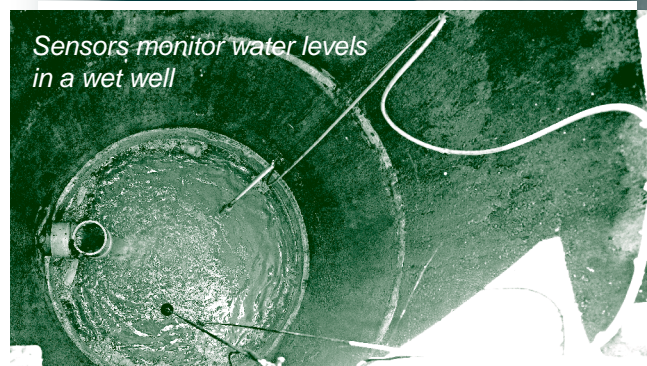
During wet weather, the load on the wastewater system is higher. At the same time, losing power to a pump station stops water from being able to continue through the system and can cause wet wells to fill.

This situation is much like leaving the bathtub running with the plug in. Eventually, the tub will fill and the water will overflow. In the case of the sewer system, however, overflows of wastewater can impact the environment and human health.

That's why the District works tirelessly to build and maintain a resilient system that is functional during emergencies. This includes back-ups for all essential equipment and clear protocols for dealing with all types of bad weather, power outages, and potential disasters.

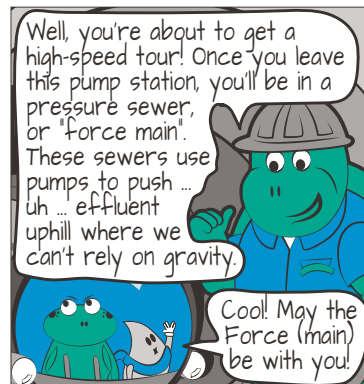
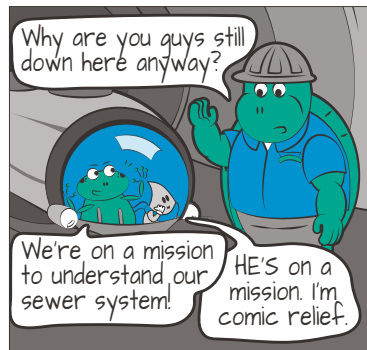
