Upcoming rate changes

The District works hard to provide excellent service at competitive rates and will continue to strive for efficiencies and cost savings in our operations. We, like our ratepayers, are experiencing increased financial pressure and must address inflation and the rising cost of goods and services.

Keeping future rates stable

The District recently completed a multi-year review of our finances. We developed a financial plan that will allow us to continue providing reliable service and keep rate increases low. In 2023, the base rate will increase by \$1.50 per month (3.6%) or \$18 per year. Annual rates will continue to increase by only \$1.50 per month through 2026.

This increase is well below the current inflation rate of about 7–9%. And by minimally raising the rates, we were able to avoid borrowing money in the future. This will save our ratepayers from paying interest on borrowed money.

With these changes, the District still maintains competitive rates locally and in the region. Most of our ratepayers pay a flat base rate which helps prevent unpredictable bills. District customers in Ridgefield pay a higher rate due to the higher cost of service for that area, which is adjusted each year based on growth.

Each day the District collects approximately eight to 10 million gallons of sewage. This comes from roughly more than 36,000 residential and 1,200 commercial customers over a roughly 47 square-mile service area. The service charge is necessary for the District to provide you with a high level of reliable and professional service.

Keep our sewers grease free

Here are some important tips to remember:

- Scrape, freeze and trash grease.
 The best way to dispose of grease is an airtight container in the garbage.
- Soap and detergents DO NOT break up grease. They may initially break up grease but lose that ability as they travel, causing problems in pipes further downstream.
- Garbage disposals DO NOT get rid of grease. They only shred leftover fats but don't get rid of it.
- Running hot tap water does NOT help.
 The grease cools down and solidifies as it flows through pipes.
- Liquid oils CAN solidify. Olive oil, for example, can still solidify in pipes as temperatures dip often lower in the pipes inside and outside of your house.
